- SDJV will submit an initial cost estimate for Phase 1, Segment 2 in August and a full GMP eight weeks after 90% design submittal













- Park is currently under a warranty period until January 2018.














Trail Projects (Sales Tax Initiative)

- Anticipate design & permitting complete by December 2018.
- Anticipate construction start in January 2019 & complete in December 2019.

- Recommended award was for \$2,500,000 for Alazan Creek.
