- What is Remediation?

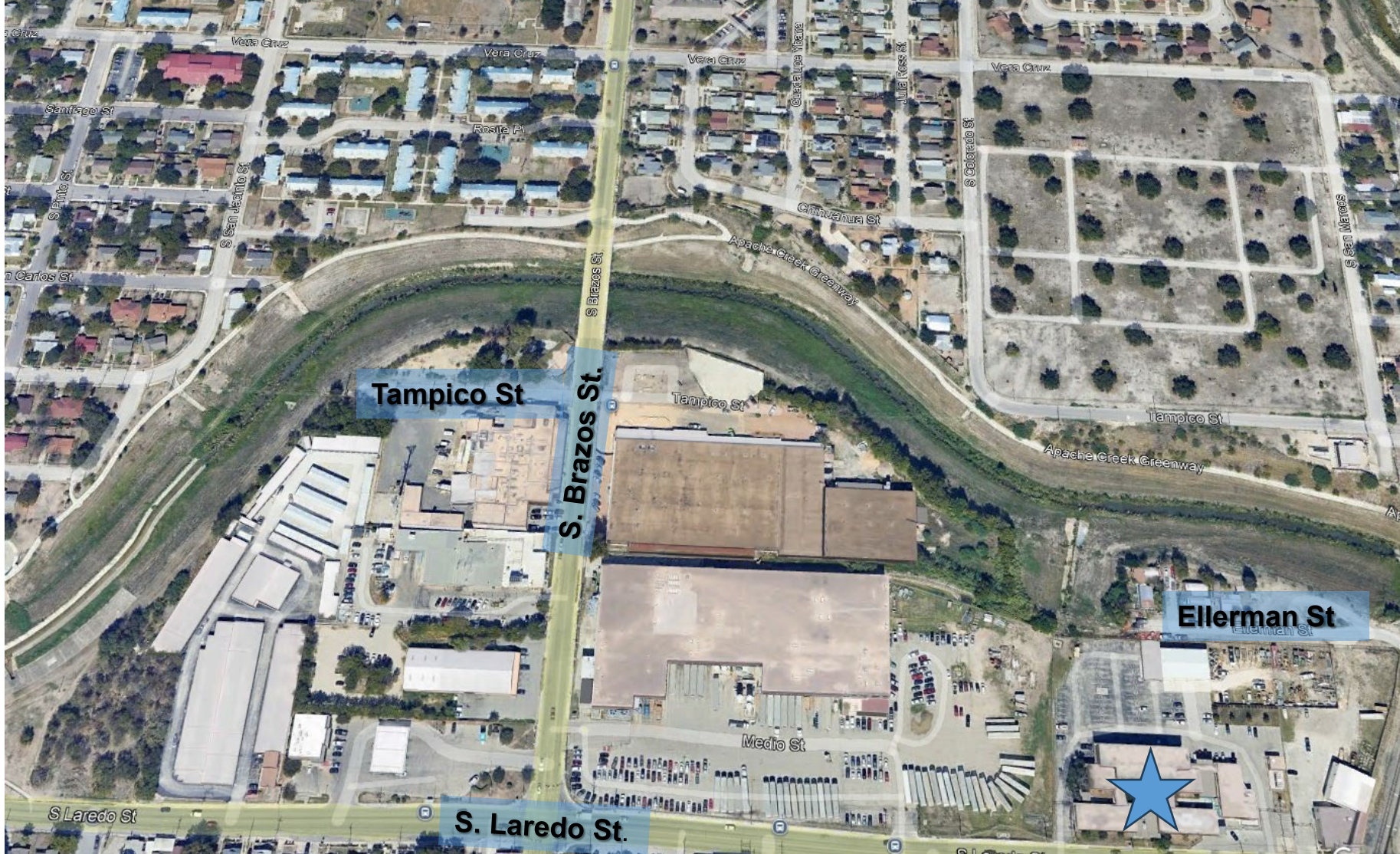
- Remediation is the process of cleaning up a contaminated environment
- The goal is to remove or reduce pollutants to protect human health and the environment
- Sources of contamination can be from a time before environmental regulations
 - This is the case for the Apache Creek Remediation Project
 - Non-hazardous lead-impacted soil

Committed to Safe, Clean, Enjoyable Creeks and Rivers.



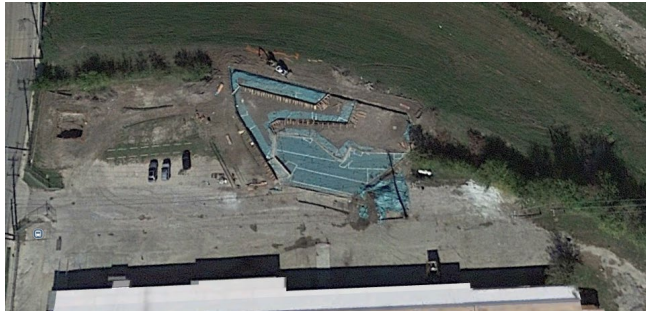
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Project Background

- **2015:** Impacted soils were identified by Opportunity Home (formerly San Antonio Housing Authority)
 - Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Voluntary Clean-up Program No. 2957
- **2019:** Remedial action was completed by Opportunity Home in adjacent to Apache Creek site



Project Background

- **2023-2024:** River Authority worked with Freese and Nichols, Inc. to develop the Remediation Plan for construction
 - United States Army Corps of Engineers requires site clean-up prior to ecosystem restoration of Apache Creek
 - CoSA owns the property and is funding the remediation project



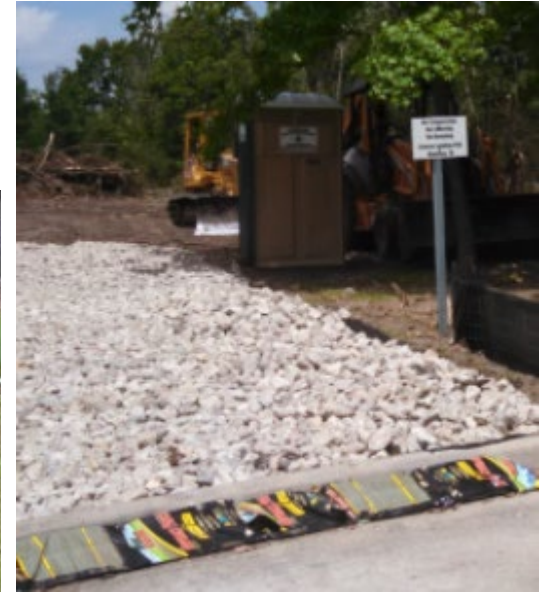
Scope of Work

- Remediation Plan consists of:
 - Temporary haul road construction and placement of stormwater pollution prevention measures
 - Shoring, excavation, loading, transporting, disposing of lead impacted soil, confirmation sampling and air monitoring
 - Embankment backfill, seeding, watering, and removal of haul road



Scope of Work

- Brazos St. trail on opposite bank will remain open
- Dust controls will be in place
- No road closures are expected



Schedule

May – September 2025: Implementation of Remediation Plan

Start Construction	May 2025

<ul style="list-style-type: none">Approx. 450 trucks clean soil for backfill
